In times of change and upheaval it is often easy to lose sight of an organization's Vision and Mission. During the past few years nothing has characterized the Division of Corrections more than change and evolution. The DOC has implemented the Justice Reinvestment Act of 2013, which initiated a dramatic shift in many correctional processes and lead to the first reduction of the state's prison population in modern history. The agency, in conjunction with the Division of Juvenile Services, the Regional Jail Authority and the WV Parole Board, has adopted the Offender Information System (OIS), a new cross agency inmate information management system, which modernized our data collection processes and improved criminal justice data sharing capabilities for the State. Our administrative staff has implemented the statewide OASIS and KRONOS fiscal and timekeeping systems. These are just a few of the major strategic initiatives that DOC staff has had to implement and manage over the past few years.

I will be retiring effective April 1, 2017, but am proud to say that I know the DOC will maintain its commitment to our Vision, Mission, and Values. Our dedicated staff deal with a wide range of offenders, from the worst that society has to offer to the drug offender that desperately needs treatment and rehabilitation. They work long shifts, often with little relief and in uncomfortable situations, and must maintain their vigilance and attention to detail. Throughout it all, staff remain committed to providing a safe, secure, and humane correctional system, focused on public safety and the successful reentry of offenders. I am so proud to have had the opportunity to work with our team of professionals and I cannot thank you enough for your dedicated service.

The coming years will bring even more change to our profession. The DOC is working through fundamental changes in how we work with Seriously Mentally Ill Offenders and the most dangerous offenders who require Restrictive Housing placements. The DOC also has new strategic goals to refocus and enhance our reentry and substance abuse treatment processes. Change never ends, it's our approach and attitude towards these opportunities that determines our success and I assure the citizens of West Virginia that the professional, dedicated, and committed staff of the DOC are up to the challenge.

I cannot describe what it has meant to me to be the Commissioner of the WV Division of Corrections. I grew up in corrections, it is a part of who I am, and it has been my singular driving force to serve the Division of Corrections to the best of my ability. *Thank you* for the opportunity to be a part of the best Corrections team in the nation.








Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, The Craik - Patton House is a splendid example of Greek Revival architecture in the Kanawha River Valley of West Virginia. Constructed in 1834, the Craik - Patton House or "Elm Grove" as it was known then, was built downtown Charleston, Virginia, now West Virginia, by James Craik, grandson of Dr. James Craik close friend and personal physician to President George Washington. Later, the home was purchased by Confederate Colonel George S. Patton I, grandfather of WW2 Gen-

eral George S. Patton. It was moved twice but ultimately was saved by the National Society of Colonial Dames in America in the State of West Virginia (NSCDAWV) and moved in 1973 to its current location.

The paws4prisons Program teaches inmates to train various types of Assistance Dogs and then manages and supervises the training of these Assistance Dogs for and in support of the mission of the paws4people foundation.

The program inmates, a very high percentage of which have PTSD or CPTSD, learn how to train (basic and advanced obedience commands) to "shelter-rescue dogs," then progress to training highly-trained Assistance Dogs, some of which know in excess of 100 commands. The program inmates also participate in the customized training, public access training, certification testing and final placement processes for their dogs, including the transfer training process of the dog's "Assistance Dog Team Partner."

The paws4prisons Program is currently the largest training venue for paws4people Assistance Dogs. Within each correctional facility, the paws4prisons Program is an Honors program, which demands the highest

behavior and performance standards of each Inmate who participates in the Program. All Program dogs reside within the prison with their as-

signed Inmate Trainers, and are taken out of the facility by either paws4people volunteers, training staff, or, in some programs, the Inmate Trainers themselves for socialization and public access training.

All inmates are pre-screened before they are allowed to apply to the program. Upon approval they are then allowed to complete an application and schedule an interview. Once an inmate passes the first three components of the application process they are then interviewed by a member of the paws4prisons staff.

Upon acceptance into the program, all inmates begin a rigorous academic and hands on training "boot camp" for a minimum of 20 weeks. During this time, inmates are required to attend all classes, complete all assignments, essays, quizzes and exams while learning the hands on training that works in conjunction with the academic program.

A "Dog Bump" is when clients are brought into meet with the dogs and to see which clients and dogs pair up. St. Mary's Correctional Center had a Dog Bump on March 9-10, 2017, where 7 people were paired up with dogs. Pictured on this page, are a few photos from that event.
