
2015 WEST VIRGINIA RECIDIVISM REPORT August 2019



This is the report of the three-year recidivism rate for all adult inmates released from a West Virginia prison or jail in calendar year 2015. Recidivism, as used in this report, is defined as an offender released during the calendar year 2015, and who was recommitted to the custody of the WV Division of Corrections & Rehabilitation (DCR) within 3 years of their release.

Recidivists by Return Type



*In 2015 a new computer system, the Offender Information System (OIS), was implemented, so it is unclear how much of the increased recidivism rate was due to a change in offender behavior or due to a change in how the data were reported. This should become clearer as future rates are reported.

HIGHLIGHTS

The 3-year recidivism rate for inmates released from DCR in 2015 is almost 28%, up nearly 4 percentage points from the previously recorded 3-year rate (based on 2014 releases; 24%). This increase, which illustrates a departure from the decreases seen beginning in 2013, was mostly comprised of parole revocations. Revocations, which had been decreasing since 2013, experienced a 4.6 point increase from the previous year. Most often the revocations had pending criminal charges (62%), as opposed to representing technical violations (38%). New crimes, which had been increasing since 2013, dropped by less than a point*.

RELEASE TYPE

Most often, inmates were released to parole (2017), however those released by court order had the highest recidivism rate (38%).

GENDER

Males were more likely to be a recidivist (almost 30% compared to 21% for females).

AGE

The average age of inmates released in 2015 was 36, the same as reported in 2014. However, inmates between 20-29 have the highest rate of recidivism, followed by those between 30-39, consistent with 2014 findings.

RACE

The majority of inmates released in 2015 where white (86%), followed by those identifying as black (11%). Black and white inmates return at similar rates (29% versus 28%).

CRIME CATEGORY

Drug and narcotic offenses had the highest number of releases in 2015 (635), followed by burglary/B&E (555). However, the recidivism rate for burglary/B&E was much higher (39% versus 23%).

TIME SINCE RELEASE

408 of the 871 recidivists (47%) were back as a new commit or revocation in one year or less.
